



# Campaign for Female Education

Camfed runs programmes in Tanzania, Zambia, Zimbabwe and Ghana, supporting girls through primary and secondary education and business training and helping them to become leaders for change in their communities.

## Camfed projects

- Rural primary schools are supplied with books and other equipment, and allocated 'safety-net funds' which enable them to provide for essential needs for children's education
- Girls are sponsored to guarantee them 4 years of secondary education, including all their needs of books, equipment, school uniform and boarding costs.
- Young women school leavers are offered micro-credit, training and peer support by Camfed's 'seed money' programme
- Camfed alumnae become part of the Cama network, acting for change not only within their own families and communities, but also at a national and even global level.

## What impacts does increasing girls' access to education have?

- Young women who now have their own money are using it to **send their siblings and children to school.**
- Young business women are **transforming the rural economy** by offering goods and services. Their increasing visibility as role models is encouraging the younger generation of girls to aspire in new ways.
- As **peer health educators**, trained by Cama, they **are reaching thousands with vital information** on HIV/AIDS, child nutrition and disease prevention.
- Young women are **joining the education, health and law professions.**
- Young women are securing platforms to **challenge agencies and governments to rise to the needs of girls** and ensure they secure their right to education.
